Television CSG funds go to support:

- Comprehensive, in-depth coverage of Virginia's government and the legislative process
- General Assembly coverage throughout the legislative session so that citizens can be informed on key issues
- Statewide broadcast of the Governor's State of the Commonwealth Address as well as support for Inauguration and other events
- Maintenance of the television studio in the basement of the General Assembly providing access for constituents and national news agencies
- Local programming that helps raise awareness, provide information, and encourage involvement
- Children's educational programming that is available to all families and is curriculum based and used to support early childhood development and literacy services

Radio CSG funds go to support:

- Comprehensive, in-depth coverage of Virginia's government and the legislative process
- Local news and information and other local programming services

ITS funds go to support teachers and schools:

- 44 school divisions
- Provide Instructional Media that is correlated to the State Standards of Learning – locally produced content with an emphasis on history and social science as well as content from other partners
- Conduit for Discovery Education Streaming subscriptions – offering needed online services at a reduced rate that saves local schools over \$270,500 on an annual basis
- Technology training for teachers – offered through workshops to individual schools or groups of schools
- An annual Conference that attracts over 400 participants and allows teachers to benefit from technology training and sharing ideas
- A partnership with the FBI that is designed to provide internet safety training for children. This uses a program developed by the FBI and makes it available for use in a school curriculum. This partnership resulted in our station receiving the FBI Director's Community Leadership Award in recognition of outstanding service to the local community and of enduring contributions to the advancement of justice
- Technical engineering services to schools – mostly in rural areas – that need engineering and technical assistance and have no other resource to turn to
- Programs for children that help promote literacy
